Tooraweenah Road Upgrade Enters Final Stage Before Construction

The Tooraweenah Road Upgrade is progressing toward construction, with key early works milestones now completed and site establishment works set to begin in the coming weeks.

Coonamble Shire Council, and the appointed construction contractor – Maas Civil, recently held a project inception meeting to confirm delivery arrangements, roles and next steps for the project.

Council also met with residents and road users at a community BBQ event on Sunday 22 March, providing an opportunity for locals to meet the project delivery team, ask questions and learn more about what to expect as construction works approach.

In the coming weeks, the focus will shift to site establishment activities, including setting up the site compound, mobilising equipment, and undertaking further engineering surveys along the road ahead of construction.

Mayor Dan Keady has stated the project is now firmly moving into the delivery phase.

“It’s great to see this project progressing, with the contractor, project team and community all coming together as we prepare for construction,” Mayor Keady said.

“Council is committed to keeping residents informed and ensuring the project delivers lasting benefits for the local community.”

The Tooraweenah Road Upgrade is a \$41.2 million project funded solely by the Australian Government. This upgrade will improve safety, access and flood resilience along this important regional route, supporting residents, agriculture, freight and tourism.

Council and the project team are committed to delivering broader value to the community throughout construction, including working with local businesses and maintaining ongoing engagement with residents in the area.

Further updates will be provided as construction activities commence.
