Construction to Commence on Tooraweenah Road

Construction on the Tooraweenah Road Upgrade will commence from Monday 4 May, marking a major milestone in the delivery of this significant regional infrastructure project.

Following the appointment of the construction contractor and completion of initial project planning, early construction activities will begin, including site clearing and preparation.

Mayor Dan Keady said it was encouraging to see the project move from planning into visible works on the ground.

“Residents will start to see real activity on the road from next week, which is a great milestone for this project,” Mayor Keady said.

“This upgrade has been a long time coming, and it’s important for our community, supporting safer travel and more reliable access for local residents, agriculture and freight.”

The Tooraweenah Road Upgrade is a \$41.2 million project funded by the Australian Government, delivering improved road conditions, increased flood resilience, and better connectivity for residents, freight operators and visitors to the region.

The project remains on schedule, with the anticipated completion timeframe unchanged. Further updates will be provided as construction activities commence.
